

# MECHANICAL INSPECTOR ONE & TWO FAMILY DWELLINGS

## Step 1: Licensure Pre-Requisites:

An applicant shall have a notarized copy of high school or general education diploma and one of the following pathways:

### EXPERIENCE PATHWAYS

**PATH 1:** three years' experience in a responsible, directly related construction position, such as a foreman, which required the ability to effectively read and interpret building plans and specifications; OR

**PATH 2:** three years' experience in an architect's or engineer's office performing building design or drafting duties

### EDUCATION PATHWAYS

**PATH 3:** graduated from a college or university with an associate degree in a design, building technology or construction-related subject; OR

**PATH 4:** graduated from a college or university with a bachelor's degree in architecture, engineering, fire science, or building technology.

## Step 2: Apply

- ✓ Submit a completed Initial Application Form, DHBC - BC/CP 1,
- ✓ \$50 application fee, and
- ✓ Written proof that the applicant has met the education/ experience requirements

## Step 3: Testing For Certification

A Mechanical Inspector of One & Two Family Dwellings shall be classified, if the person has passed the following:

NCPCCI Test 4A Mechanical One and Two Family Dwelling test module

OR

ICC Test M1 Residential Mechanical Inspector test module

### How to take the ICC test modules

- Register and schedule for testing
- \$241 per module
- 60 questions in 2 hours, open book
- Passing score of 75% or higher is required for Certification
